BOUDICCA



Boudicca was a Celtic Queen and a member of the Iceni tribe who lived in Norfolk. She was married to King Prasutagus and they had two daughters. Sadly, in 59 AD, Boudicca's husband died. As a woman she had no right to **inherit** her husband's property. Prasutagus hoped to protect Boudicca by leaving half of his property to the Emperor Nero. However, the Emperor decided to take all of her property. Boudicca joined forces with the neighbouring tribe of the Trinovantes and led a **rebellion** against the Romans. Although she successfully won her first few battles, her people were **defeated** at the Battle of Watling Street in 61 AD.

Born: 30 AD, Britannia

Death: 61 AD, Britannia

AD	Anno Domini: a Latin phrase meaning "in the year of the Lord", which is used when referring to a year after Jesus Christ was born
inherit	to be given a persons money or property when they die
rebellion	a violent act organised by a group of people
defeated	to lose a battle
